



Project area extends from Oklahoma Ave NE to Benning Road Metro Station and includes Minnesota Avenue between Benning Road and Minnesota Avenue Metro Station

Study Area

About the project area:

- 2 mile corridor including roadway and bridges
- Adjacent to H Street/Benning streetcar line
- Crosses the Anacostia River, Kingman Island, DC 295 and Metro and CSX tracks
- Includes 2 Metrorail stations
- Benning Road is primarily 3-lanes in each direction from 15th Street NE to Minnesota Ave
- Benning Road is primarily 2-lanes in each direction from Minnesota Ave to Benning Road Metro Station











The Benning Road Streetcar Extension Feasibility Study completed in 2013 developed two alternatives for the project area:



Traffic Volumes in Average Daily Traffic (ADT)




Historic Preservation -Section 106
